



Knightdale, N.C., urging it to impose a curfew. The minutes of the meeting summarize his evidence:

"Lerrel Marshmon, 308 Laurens Way, Knightdale, stated that he gets off work at 10:00 P.M. and frequently the gang members come onto his property. He stated that the kids verbalized swear words to his wife. Mr. Marshmon stated that he came outside to ask the kids to leave his property and they threatened him and his family. He explained that he thinks the problem is very serious."

Among more than 200 cities with curfews, officials in 96 percent consider them "very" or "somewhat" effective.


Macallair says that when he gives officials his evidence about curfews, he usually gets "no response." After Marshmon and others spoke in Knightdale, the town instituted a curfew, and this summer decided not to change it. Knightdale is among numerous communities that have recently turned to curfews to crack down on an alleged rise in juvenile crime. San Francisco, Houston, Washington, Oklahoma City, New Haven, Conn., Kinston, N.C., and the New York communities of Rochester, Oswego, Fulton, East Syracuse and Wyoming County—those are just some of the places that have created, expanded, restored or considered curfews over the past several months [of 2006].
