

Interdisciplinary Projects: The Documentary Film

- 1. Watch the documentary film the first time.
 - a. Notice and take notes on the many pieces of background information: names, dates, places, events, terms, trends anything that helps to build your background knowledge on the topic.
 - b. Notice the \underline{B} and the \underline{A} s used to support that \underline{B} . Write them down on your *Topic Map*.
 - c. Take notes on the B and the As. How do those overlap with your project's As, Os, and B?

- 3. All research requires a close noticing and noticing of patterns. Watch the documentary film a second time to do more close noticing.
 - a. This time, pause the film to transcibe word-for-word the quotes that support your <u>As</u>, the <u>Os</u>, or the <u>B</u>. Also, consider quotes that may be used for your background or conclusion sections. Use one notecard for each quote.
 - b. *Paraphrase* each quote = write your summary of the quote.
 - c. Create the *My Ideas* section: explain to yourself why this quote is helpful to your project and where it might fit (e.g., A1-2, O2, Background, etc).
