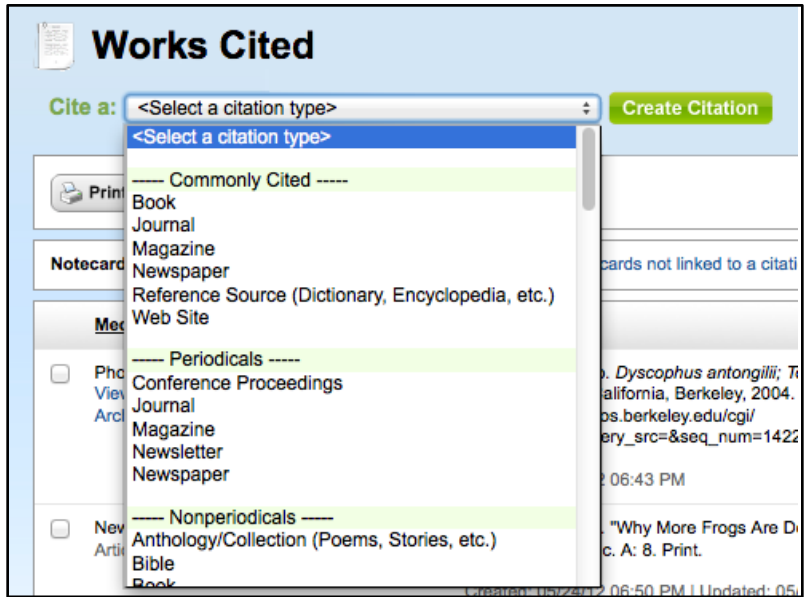

**Interdisciplinary Projects: The Documentary Film**  
2013-2014

1. Watch the documentary film the first time.
  - a. Notice and take notes on the many pieces of background information: names, dates, places, events, terms, trends – anything that helps to build your background knowledge on the topic.
  - b. Notice the B — and the As used to support that B. Write them down on your *Topic Map*.
  - c. Take notes on the B and the As. How do those overlap with your project's As, Os, and B?
2. Create a Works Cited entry in Noodletools:



3. All research requires a close noticing and noticing of patterns. Watch the documentary film a second time to do more close noticing.
  - a. This time, pause the film to transcribe word-for-word the quotes that support your As, the Os, or the B. Also, consider quotes that may be used for your background or conclusion sections. Use one notecard for each quote.
  - b. *Paraphrase* each quote = write your summary of the quote.
  - c. Create the *My Ideas* section: explain to yourself why this quote is helpful to your project and where it might fit (e.g., A1-2, O2, Background, etc).
